## Alderman's: Route Map



## Alderman's (SS83684232) Length: 2.4 Kilometres

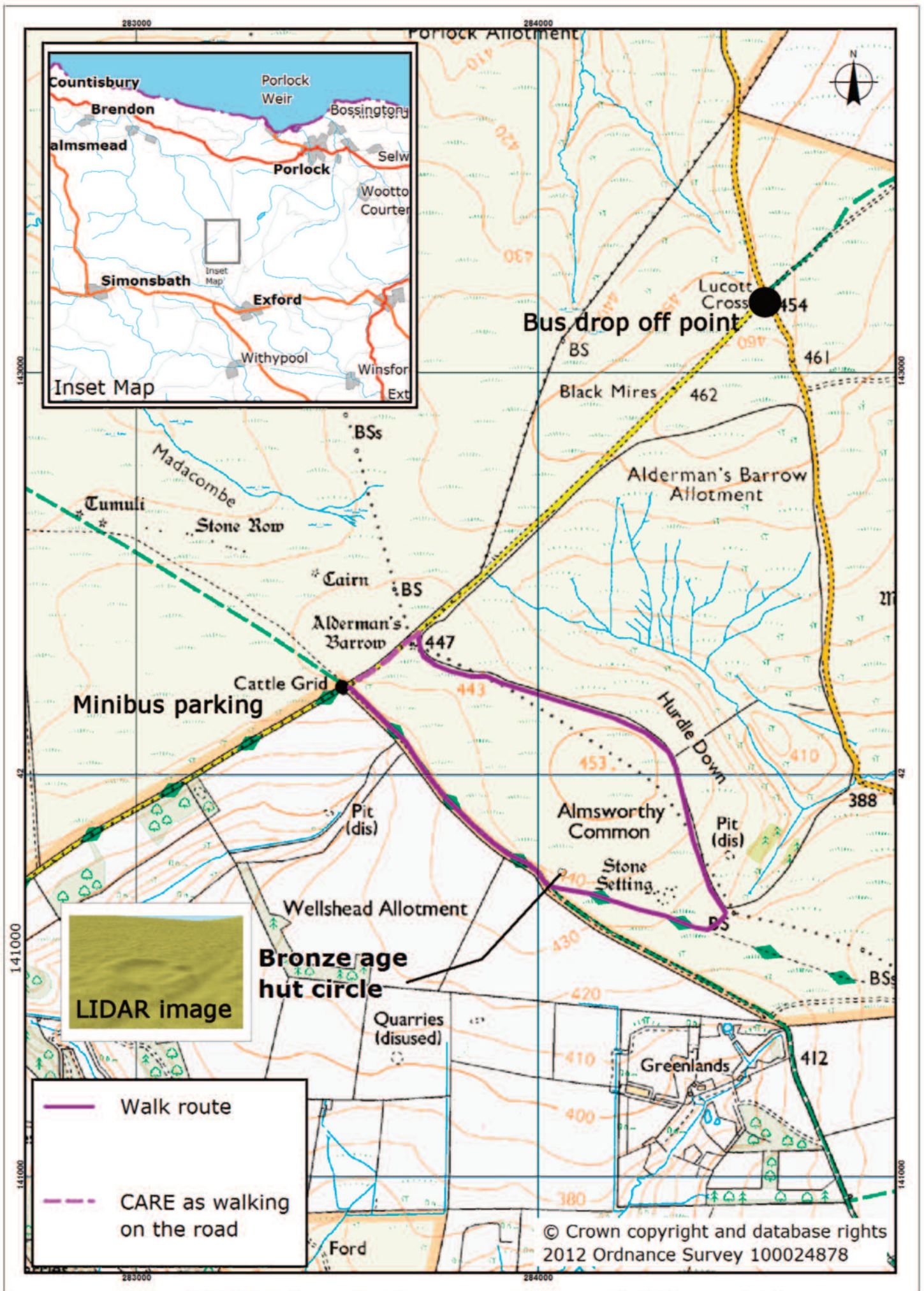
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**Arrival:** Alderman's Barrow is ten minutes North of Exford village. Roadside minibus parking at Alderman's. Coaches can drop off at Lucott Cross (GR SS845 432), with a 1km walk in along a minor road.

**Directions:** Commence from the WWII antiquity star which highlighted to the artillery important archaeological sites to be avoided. Then from the roadside Barrow follow the well defined track along the Exmoor hedge bank and wire fence going South East. After some 800m a sunken grassy quarry is at a right angle, 30m to your right, defined by some raised humps, providing a great snack base. Returning to the hedge bank,

follow it further along to the corner of the fence. Red deer and Exmoor ponies can often be viewed in the distance from here. Turn back North West on an obvious track that goes right through the standing stones and ultimately back to the minibus. Look out for the Bronze Age hut circle over the brow of the common, your path goes right by it but the appearance is of only a circular bank.
