Pinkery: Route Map



Pinkery (SS72294106). Length: 3.9 Kilometres

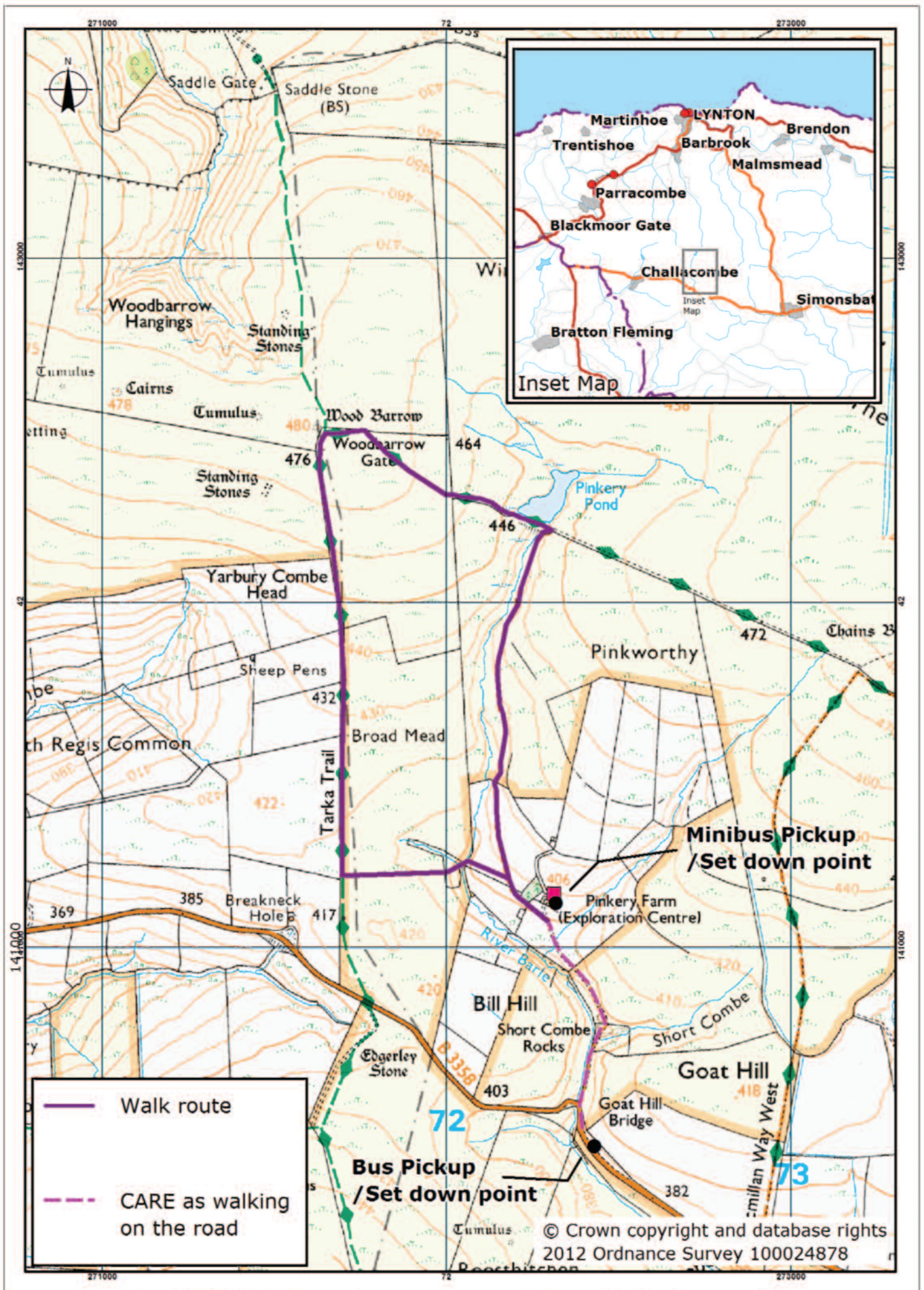
Arrival: There is coach parking at Goat Hill Bridge (GR SS724 405), with minibus parking at the Pinkery Centre by prior arrangement. External toilets are also available at Pinkery.

Directions: From the main road at Goat Hill Bridge follow the track to Pinkery bearing West at the sign to the pond just before the centre. Pass the wind turbine and keeping the stream on your left, pass through the gate and follow the small track to the pond. Turn West, along the dam wall, and follow signs to Woodbarrow. A great spot for stories of Bronze Age barrows. If the whole class

jumps on Wood barrow at the same time a slight vibration can be felt.

If not returning the same way, turn South and follow the bridleway along the county and former Royal Forest boundary to Broad Mead, cutting back East, beyond the small very wet valley, via the 'mires' just South of East at (GR SS717 413) crossing the stream and aiming for the wind turbine.
